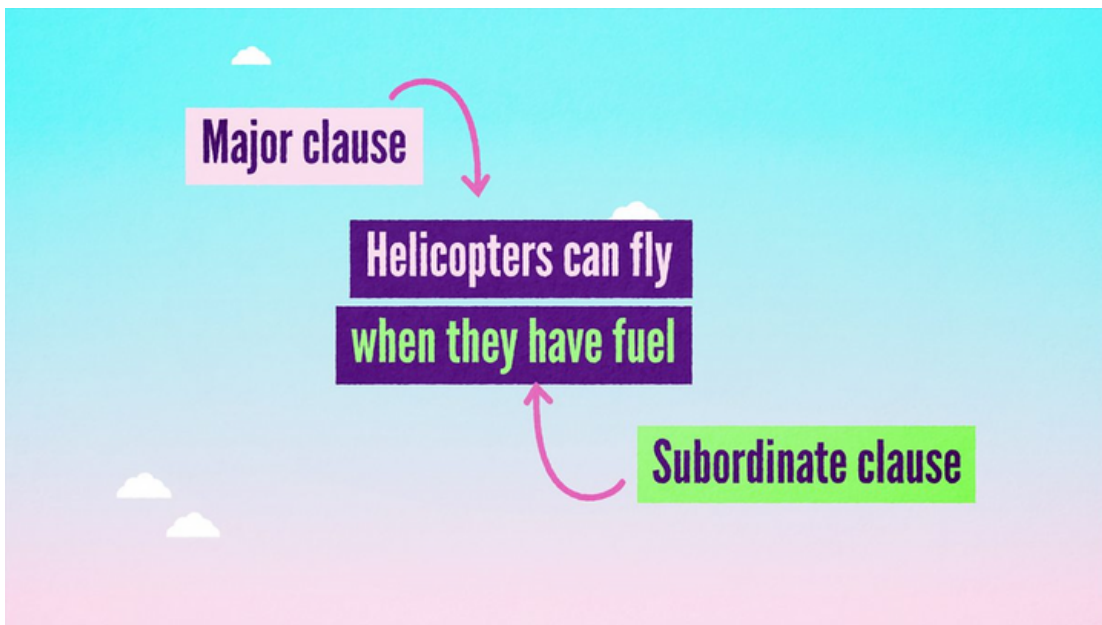

# Introduction..

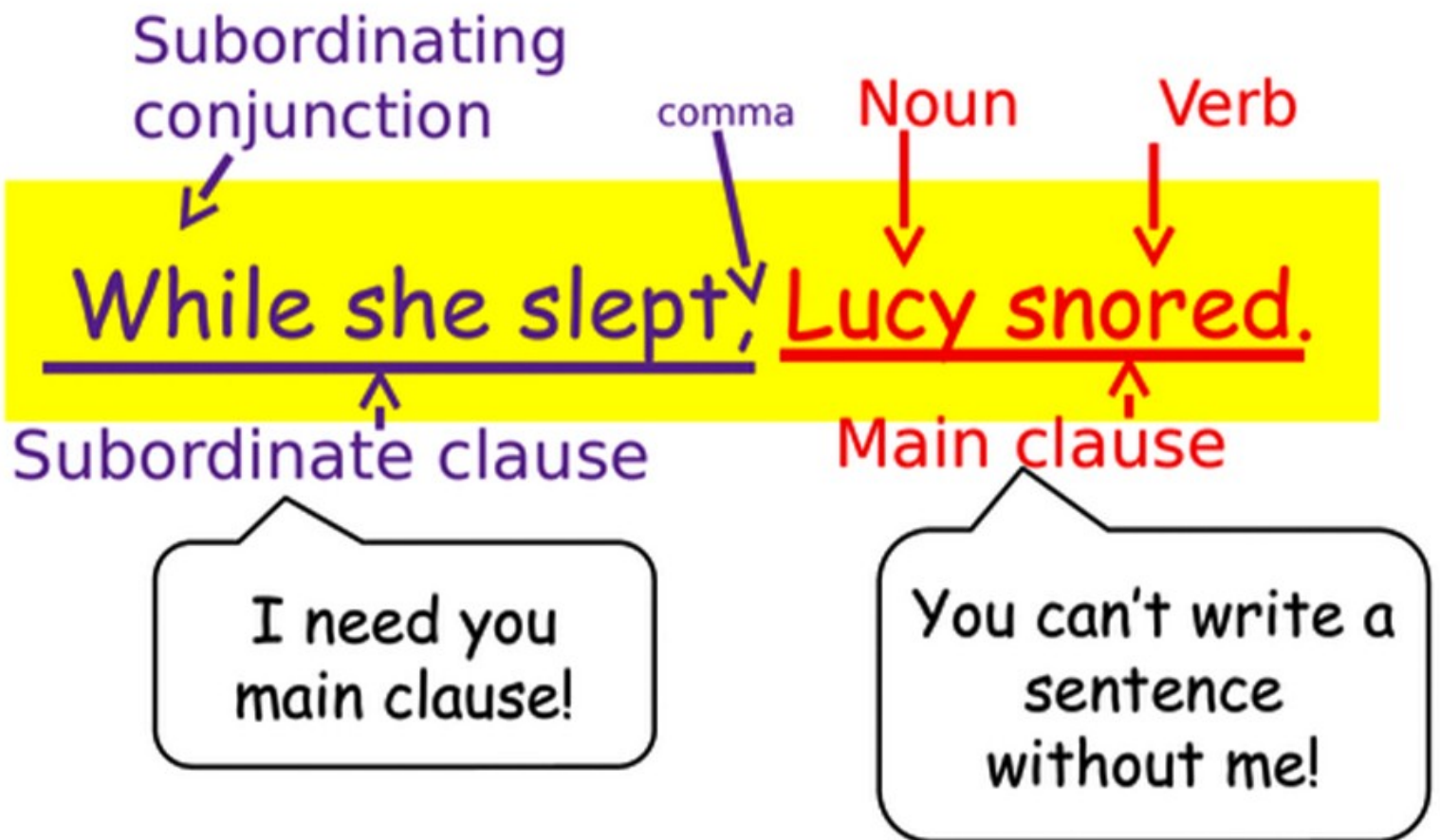
Subordinate clause is a clause that cannot stand alone as a complete sentence; it merely complements a sentence's main clause, thereby adding to the whole unit of meaning.

Why we use it?

this clause's function is clear:

it provides informational support to the main event of the sentence

# TASC Tips -

Remember that a subordinate clause cannot stand alone as a sentence because it does not provide a complete thought.

The reader is left wondering, "So what happened?" A word group that begins with a capital letter and ends with a period must contain at least one main clause.

Otherwise, you will have written a fragment, a major error.
